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Contractor Selected for Route 364 Page Phase 3 *Public Meeting Showing Designs/Schedule March 26*

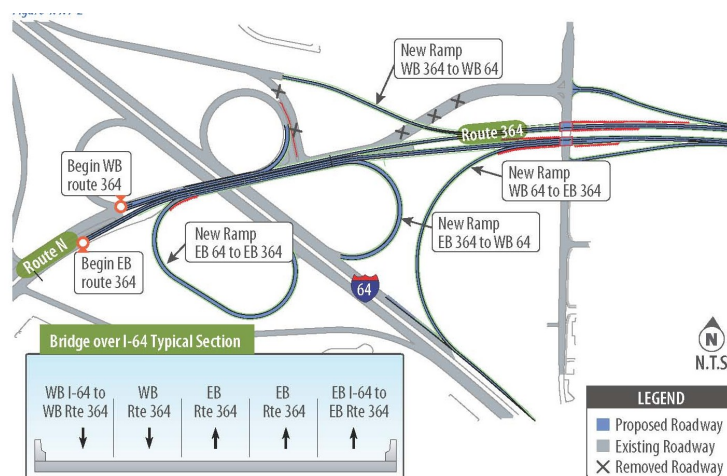
The Route 364 Page Phase 3 Design-Build project was approved and announced February 6. The new roadway will include building a four-lane divided highway starting at the current end of Route 364 at Route 94 and Mid Rivers Mall Drive. The new road will go west for nearly nine miles and intersect I-64 at the current I-64 and Route N interchange in Lake Saint Louis. The design includes bridges at the cross streets of Motherhead, Gutermuth and Hanley roads. There will be additional interchange work at Route 94, a new interchange at Route K and at Bryan Road, a half interchange at Henke Road and additional ramps at I-64.

The design plan production will continue for several more months and construction will begin sometime in May. The road is scheduled to open in three segments in the fall of 2014, between Labor Day and Halloween. The basic design and construction schedule is available at www.modot.org/route364.

A public open house meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 26 from 4 to 7 p.m. in the Community Center Rotunda at the St. Charles Community College in Cottleville. Information from the public meeting will also be posted on the project website.

Page Constructors Joint Venture, including local contractors Fred Weber Inc, Millstone-Bangert Inc, and Kolb Grading, along with designer Parsons Transportation Group is the winning contractor.

The \$118.2 million project is a cost-share project with MoDOT, St. Charles County and local municipalities within the county. The local share is \$57 million.
