## Two More Weeks of Impacts at I-70/Mid Rivers Mall Dr

The work zone at the I-70 and Mid Rivers Mall Drive interchange continues to have lane closures on I-70 and ramp closures for Mid Rivers. We are on schedule to open the interchange and the lanes on I-70 by early November.

During the weeks of October 21 and October 28, we will have several more closures as crews make the final touches to convert the interchange to a diverging diamond. Starting late Monday, October 21, the Mid Rivers Mall Drive bridge over I-70 will be completely closed until late Wednesday, weather permitting. During this bridge closure, there will be access to I-70 but only right turns at the two ends of the bridge. Another bridge closure will happen the week of October 28 to finalize the striping and the traffic control devices.

We also have the ramp from eastbound I-70 to Mid Rivers Mall Drive closed. Motorists will need to exit at the new exit ramp just east of Mid Rivers Mall Drive and take the outer road to Suemandy Drive to access Mid Rivers Mall Drive. The new interchange will have a ribbon cutting dedication November 8.

## Route 364 Traffic Changes at Bryan Road on Nov 1

The Route 364 Page Phase 3 project will involve some traffic pattern changes in October. The new Bryan Road bridge over Route 364 will open by the end of the week of October 21, and the new Route N connection to Bryan Road will open late on November 1.

Route N at Stump Road connecting to South Outer 364 will be closed late on October 23 until late on November 1. Crews are finishing the construction of Route N connecting to Bryan Road, which will open November 1. There will be no access from Stump Road to Route N during these nine days. The previously closed cross road at Twin Chimneys Blvd west will reopen to allow Route N traffic to cross to South Outer 364. Route N will be open to businesses and residents west of this crossing, but it will be a dead end street.

On November 1, Route N will reopen with a new connection to Bryan Road. There will be a new signalized intersection at Route N and Bryan Road. The temporary crossing at Twin Chimneys Blvd will be closed permanently.
