There are a lot of changes coming over the next several months as part of the ongoing I-70 at Fairgrounds Road and Fifth Street project. The biggest upcoming change will be the week of April 25 when Veterans Memorial Parkway between Fairgrounds Road and Fifth Street becomes a one-way road (eastbound traffic only).

The Gateway Green Light program is a collaboration between MoDOT, St. Charles County and the cities of Cottleville, Dardenne Prairie, Lake St. Louis, O'Fallon, Saint Charles, Saint Peters, Weldon Spring and Wentzville. The goal is to actively manage and monitor signals in real time to help reduce delays and improve traffic flow, especially on routes that cross through different municipalities.
